The All Saints' Day celebration has a long history in the worship life of the Christian Church. It began as a commemoration of the martyrs who had died for the faith, and it has since become a day when we honour and remember those who, in death, have joined the Church Triumphant and the faithful saints of the present who serve Jesus Christ. Martin Luther held that all Christians are sinners and saints simultaneously because of our rebellious nature, yet saints because of salvation in Jesus.

Today, by reading their names, ringing a bell, and lighting a candle, we remember those dear to our congregation who have died during the past year. Anyone in attendance will be able to come forward to light a candle. This will proceed spontaneously, without the ushers' direction. Following the lighting of the candles, we proclaim the message of hope and life eternal through Jesus Christ. May all the past and present saints endure forever in God's grace!
